Report of the Seshadripuram Educational Association for the year ending 31st March 2017

MANAGEMENT

- The Ordinary Meetings of the Board of Trustees were held on the last Tuesday of every month.
- Various Sub-Committees of the Board of Trustees were formed to handle key issues like Student Admission, Staff Selection, Purchases, Building, Audit & Finance, Discipline, Canteen and Establishment of New Educational Institutions.
- Academic Quality Improvement, Student Support and Welfare Measures and Value Addition Programmes were dealt with by Governing Councils in each of our institutions constituted for the purpose.

OUR INSTITUTIONS

- Each of our institutions has a Governing Council headed by a Trustee duly constituted as per University / Board guidelines.
- All our institutions are provided with spacious, well-ventilated buildings with necessary *state-of-the-art* laboratories, libraries, digital libraries, smart boards, furniture, audio-visual equipments and other teaching facilities required for imparting sound education.
- Our staff and students are exposed to the extensive use of Information & Communication Technologies in teaching-learning processes.

NEW INSTITUTIONS AND COURSES

- Opening of Vocational Study Centre of National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) at Seshadripuram First Grade College, Yelahanka is under process.
- Post-Graduate Programmes like M.Com. (Financial Accounting) with 30 students and M.Com. (International Business) with 30 students were started in Seshadripuram College, Seshadripuram, Bengaluru - 560 020 from the academic year 2016-17.

- M.Com.(General) with 50 students and M.Com.(Financial Accounting) with 40 students were started in Seshadripuram First Grade College, Yelahanka, from the academic year 2016-17.
- A High Powered Committee comprising of Trustees is formed to oversee the effective implementation of Tumakuru Educational Projects.
- Board of Trustees decided to start new Pre-Primary, Primary and High Schools from the academic year 2017-18 at Site No.32, Geddalahalli, Tumakuru.
- Building ready for housing Pre-University College from the academic year 2017-18 at CA Site No.5, Melekote-Veerasagara Layout, Tumakuru.
- On 27-2-2017, Local Inspection Committee of Tumkur University visited proposed Degree College at Site No.3, Tumkur in regard to grant of affiliation for the academic year 2017-18.

STUDENT ADMISSION

- The provision of Right to Education Act is implemented in all our schools in letter and spirit.
- Due regard is given to the roster system in admissions prescribed by the Government of Karnataka.
- SET Merit Scholarship of Rs.10,000 were presented to 568 Pre-University and Degree students amounting to Rs.56.80 lakhs. Exemption in Management Fee was extended to 158 students scoring 95% and above in the qualifying exam and joining our Pre-University Colleges.
- 50% fee concession was extended to 21 physically challenged students.

BENCH MARKING

- Seshadripuram College has been ranked 28th among the Top 50 Commerce Colleges in India as per 'The India Today' Nielsen Survey published vide its issue dated May 30, 2016.
- There are 40 Ph.D. holders among our faculty.

Attendance Tracking System

To make sure that marking attendance is both easy and accurate, a cloud based application is adopted by our institutions. Every student and faculty are provided a login ID and password to track their attendance status on a day to day basis. In addition, assignments, reference material and interesting articles can also be shared. SMS and email alerts and communication are embedded in all appropriate components.

A major technology initiative for all the institutions is to share the updates real time on the app of the respective institution. The app can be downloaded by anybody and get notifications about the updates of the institution.

- Bangalore University decided to institute Gold Medals to the topper in BBA and BCA final examinations in the name



 Alumni Associations have been set up in all our institutions to provide a platform for the alumni to re-establish their links with the institution.

QUALITY IMPROVEMENT

- All our libraries are fully digitized and are provided with adequate number of books, magazines, journals including CDs for effective dissemination of information and knowledge to the students.
- The Management collects feedback about each of the teaching faculty and non-teaching staff and conducts Faculty Development Programs to strengthen them further academically.
- In order to provide value education, various training programs are organized on a regular basis for our teachers, office staff and librarians, as also students and their parents. Emphasis is laid on life-skills enhancement. Personality development programs are a routine feature in our institutions.

- The performance of staff is reviewed and apprised once in every three years from the date of declaration of their probationary period.
- An Annual Joint Meeting of Trustees and Heads of the Institutions was held on 29-7-2016 to discuss ways and means to strengthen the academic work for the year 2016-17.

HOSTEL

 Students' Halls of Residence were provided for about 52 women students studying in various undergraduate and post-graduate courses at Seshadripuram First Grade College Campus, Yelahanka. A Hostel Committee constituted for the purpose oversees the effective working of the Hostel.

SKILL DEVELOPMENT

 The Placement and Training Cells of our degree colleges have conducted various Skill Development Programs for degree students to enhance their employability. Nearly 800 students have benefited from this programme of the Government of India.

INTERNATIONALIZATION OF EDUCATION

- Seshadripuram Academy for Global Excellence (SAGE), established in 2011, promotes advanced learning for zealous students through its links with foreign universities like Northeastern State University, Oklahoma, USA; University of Central Oklahoma, USA; University of Chester, UK and University of Wisconsin Riverfalls, USA. Through this global exposure, students become familiar with diverse cultures, thereby raising their stature and quality to be at par with the best in the world. Students are thus exposed to a whole new learning experience which brightens their job prospects at home and abroad and helps in creating global graduates who are future-ready.
- About 22 students went to the US and 3 students joined the University of Chester in the UK to pursue their higher education during the year 2016-17.

 Nearly 45 teachers are involved in active research, and are pursuing M.Phil / Ph.D. Programs in various universities.

- Students are given enough opportunities to learn beyond class rooms. Several visits are arranged to important historical places, museums, industries and outbound activities are arranged in an environmentally suitable places. Exposure of this kind has helped students to get first-hand experience onsite / location.
